Abstract

The formation of an archaeological identity

Based on 31 interviews with former archaeology students, it is possible to deduce five specific elements that are believed to help students in prehistoric archaeology at the University of Copenhagen in their formation of an archaeological identity. It is 1) the study environment, 2) the basic courses and visits to museums and collections, 3) the courses in archaeological theory, 4) the work with primary material in the BA-projects and 5) the lectures after the BA-projects and thesis. If we strengthen these five elements we may optimize the education of our new colleagues.
