Abstract

Roots of Vindinge

Unfortunate afforestation on a burial site

The burial site at Stålmosegård in Vindinge is Zealand's largest from the Roman Iron Age. It was excavated over a series of campaigns from 1972-2013, and in 1983, a part of it was afforested with spruce. This made it possible to compare the archaeological source material between areas with and without trees. At this site, the tree roots caused significant damage, in particular to the ceramics, and they were a major nuisance during fieldwork. The article uses this case study to increase focus on the challenges that climate-related afforestation in the coming years may entail from an archaeological point of view.
